## **2023-2024**

### **1. INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY ON 21.06.2023**

The NSS units of the college organized International Yoga Day in Room No. AB-07 under the supervision of Madam Principal Dr. Swastika Padhi. The program commenced with the lighting of the lamp and inviting the guests to the dais. In this program, Administrative Bursar Dr. Binod Bihari Patra, as the Chief Yoga Instructor, enlightened the participants on the essence of yoga and demonstrated different yogic postures. IQAC Coordinator Dr. P.K. Ratha appealed to every student to adopt yoga to attain peace and concentration of mind. Programme Officer Sri A.K. Pradhan and Smt. A. Sai Lakshmi coordinated the program successfully. Around 55 student volunteers from the college participated in the event.



### **2. TREE PLANTATION PROGRAMME ON 08.07.2023.**

**36. Topic: Clean Energy for Future; Department: Physics; Date: 4th May 2023; Location: Alapur Village**


